CELEBRATING 20 YEARS OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- In 1997, under the leadership of Dannette Mitchell had the foresight to solidify our presence in Northern California by creating this Foundation.
- 2 Under the leadership of **Della**Johnson, we registered with the state of California progressive bylaws that have helped us stay organized, efficient, and mission minded.
- Hosted our very first event, a Wine and Cheese Reception introducing ourselves to the community as change agents and thought leaders.
- Have been able to grow our giving from \$2,000 a year for four years to \$5,000 a year for each of our scholarship recipients.
- Have had over 25 active Board members from various distinguished professions including the Honorable Teri L. Jackson, who has the distinction of being the first African American Women to serve as the Superior Court Presiding Judge of San Francisco.

- 6 Engaged over 10 corporate sponsors including Google, Facebook, and Wells Fargo.
- Became truly embedded in the community by accepting our first community member to join the Board, Mildred Swann in 2008.
- Held major public fundraisers including The Jennifer Holliday Concert and An Evening with Gershwin at the Performing Arts Center in San Mateo.
- Picked up the mantel of educating the community at large by hosting annual Financial Fortitude workshops, starting in 2010.
- 10 Formed a relationship with the Betty Shabazz Girls, a group of young girls from East Palo Alto learning life skills to help them navigate their future.



Awarded sixteen scholarships to Bay Area high school scholars going to various colleges including four HBCUs, four UCs, two state schools, and one lyy League institution among others.

1 2 Awarded \$26, 500 in scholarships in 2018, highest award amount ever for one fiscal year.

13 To date, have awarded almost \$150,000 in scholarships to our scholars.

14 Endowed scholarships based on the generosity of four women to distinguished themselves by having scholarships named for their generous giving:

Evelyn Neely (2) Kathlyn L. Campbell Bessie L. Stewart-Ross Regina Wallace-Jones

15 Been able to maintain Board member Barbara Ann Brown from inception till now.

16 Initiated a gender equality clause and allowed a male to join our Board of Directors, Imo Udom.

17 Under the leadership of Bessie Stewart-Ross, the Board of Directors cultivated a strong, diverse donor base to support the mission of the Foundation resulting in an increase in total annual giving for the last five consecutive years.

18 Became aggressive in our tactics to not just maintain our principal but increase our revenue. We have never lost any of our principal.

19 Collectively, have grown to have a net worth of over \$500,000.

20 Continue to recruit and engage our donors with events such as our Donor Appreciation Event.



The Foundation's financial literacy workshop began in 2010, is held annually, and continues to provide a vital service to the community. The goal is to provide practical personal finance advice and to inspire our community to practice sound financial habits. In addition, we want to move beyond community education to changing behavior.

The intent of the 2019 Financial Fortitude Workshop: "Building Your Financial Legacy" workshop series was to inspire individuals and families to become fiscally fit and proactive in planning for financially fortified futures. This involved an expert panel addressing the following topics lead by Board member **Farralon Udom**. The panel was followed by small groups on the following topics:

- It Can Be Done: Using FHA and VA Loans to Build Wealth Through Real Estate by Nneka Jenkins, Realtor
- Fast Finance: Manage Your Personal Finances in 1 Hour a Month, by Farralon Udom, Senior Investment Associate, RBC Wealth Management; and Kent Mannina, National Sales Manager, Wells Fargo
- Financial Wellness for Women by Anna Sergunina, Financial Advisor, Main Street Financial Planning
- Home Buying: Steps to Buying a Home, Understanding the Pitfalls, and Creating Equity/Value in Your Home by Marlena Wong, CFO, Koret Foundation





However, an increase of \$10,000 in donations would afford an increase in scholarships by an average of \$500 and an expanded literacy workshop while bracing for an anticipated downturn in the market.
