NAMING OF SCHOLARSHIPS FOR 2022

The Evelyn Neely Scholarship

Awarded to De'Yani Dillard

Named in honor of Evelyn Neely, the scholarship provides support to the awardee for four years.

Evelyn Neely is a long-time supporter who is grounded in family values, serious about social issues and committed to serving her community. This named scholarship caps a giving history from Evelyn Neely of over \$100,000 to the Foundation!

A resident of San Mateo County for over 45 years, Neely moved to San Mateo in 1968 to pursue a career as a social worker. Earning a B.A. in Sociology from Wiley College in Marshall, TX and a MSW from the University of Texas, Austin, Neely worked for the San Mateo County for 32 years. She retired as Director of the Income Maintenance Division of Human Services Agency in 2000 and was the highest-ranking African American woman in county government at the time.

Neely was one of ten women chosen for the San Mateo County Women's Hall of Fame. The aim of this prestigious award is to recognize outstanding women for their achievements and contributions to the overall wellbeing of San Mateo County and its citizens. However, she is most proud of her family, which includes two sons, two grandsons, and two great-grandsons.

A dedicated and proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Neely was initiated in 1953 in the Alpha lota Chapter in Marshall, TX and she is a charter member of the San Francisco-Peninsula Alumnae Chapter.

The Evelyn Neely 2022 scholarship award is being given to De'Yani Dillard who will attend Dillard University and plans to major in psychology. De'Yani values building a safe space for herself and others both in and out of school. She is the President of the Black Student Union (BSU) at her high school, Ruth Asawa School of the Arts. De'Yani is also a co-founder and Alumni Mentor for the Radical Monarchs, a social justice group for young girls of color that started in 2014.

After completing her degree, she aspires to become a therapist, pursuing a career that would incorporate her interests in art, building trust, and connecting with her community. "I'm doing it for myself, and also for my family."


